Q: Hi again, thank you for your advice to contact CTL to have older courses removed from my cluttered Blackboard course list.

If I DON'T want the courses actually <u>removed</u> from Blackboard (as I might need some content from them periodically) is there a way to just "hide" them from my day-to-day working course list?? ~ Hide N Seek?

A: Dear Hide N Seek, good question! There IS a way to turn off the visibility of courses in the Blackboard module **My Courses** on your Welcome page. The module Courses: Quick View does <u>not</u> allow this control. When you click on the **gear** on the **My Courses** module header bar you enter a **Personalize: My**

Courses screen with an Edit Course List area. You'll see all courses available to you here, and using


Use the Gear icon on the header bar to sort your course list and change your visibility preferences

the check boxes you can set whether or not the course names are visible, and what detail you wish to be displayed for each. You'll also see the re-ordering feature (up/down arrows) to the far left of each course line that's used to change their order in your list. You may like having current courses at the top for easy access! Remember, you can always go back into these settings with the gear icon and fine-tune your choices, including visibility to any hidden course content.
