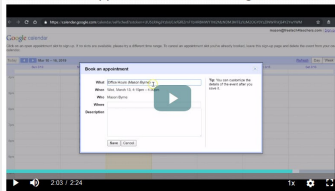
1. A one-page document that explains their **syllabus alignment service**, with UCM-specific access instructions.

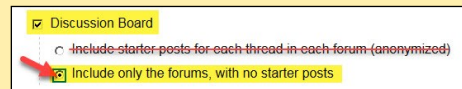
Dear Debbie,



**Q:** The last time I used Course Copy to bring content into an empty Blackboard shell for the new semester, I also got all the student thread content copied into my new Discussion Boards. I had to go in and delete all of those former class conversations which took a lot of time. Is there an easy way to prevent this? ~ Tired from Deleting

**A:** Dear Tired, YES, this actually does have an easy solution. What you're experiencing is very common. There's a single setting that prevents the inclusion of Discussion Board student content during the Course Copy process.

After choosing Course Copy from Packages and Utilities in your Control Panel and then the destination for that content, you specify what you want to copy. When you check Discussion Board, you see the first option is selected, but you'll need to select that **2nd** option "forums with no starter posts" to copy your Discussion Board assignment information without the previous semester's student posts!
